













How to find the full text of a particular journal article

	<p>How to find the full text of a particular journal article</p>
	<p><i>"This looks like a great article for me. How do I find it? Can I just Google it?"</i></p> <p><i>"Not everything on Google is free. Your best option is to check the UQ Library catalogue. I'll show you how"</i></p>
	<p>First identify the article title. It's usually just after the author and date.</p>
	<p>On the library home page, choose the journal articles tab. Type the article title in the text box and click search.</p>
	<p>Find the article in the list and click the title link. Click on the PDF or full text link to open the complete article.</p>
	<p><i>"That didn't work. What else can I try?"</i></p> <p><i>"You can go straight to the source. See if the journal title is in the UQ Library catalogue."</i></p>

 <p>Identify the journal title</p> <p>Culvenor, Clare, 2000, 'Commonwealth heritage protection legislation', <u>Indigenous Law Bulletin</u>, vol.5, no.3, pp.17-19.</p> <p>www.library.uq.edu.au</p>	<p>Identify the name of the journal. It comes after the article title. Often it's in <i>italics</i> or <u>underlined</u>.</p>
	<p>On the library home page, choose journals. Type in the journal name and click search. Click on the journal name in the search results to see what UQ has access to. Look at online holdings. You'll need to check to make sure the date you need is available.</p>
	<p>Identify the year and the volume. This will determine which online option you should select. Choose an online option that covers the year you need. Click the via link to access the journal homepage.</p>
	<p>Browse the journal archive to find the year and volume you need. In the list of contents look for your article by title. Click on the pdf or full text link to open the complete article.</p>
 <p>But there are no online options for my article so how do I get it?</p> <p>This journal is only held in print. Visit the library to photocopy.</p> <p>www.library.uq.edu.au</p>	<p><i>"But there are no online options for my article so how do I get it?"</i></p> <p><i>"This journal is only held in print. You'll need to visit the library to photocopy from the printed volume."</i></p>
	<p>If the journal is held at another campus, you can use the Document Delivery service and have it sent to you.</p>

	<p><i>"But the journal doesn't show up in the catalogue at all"</i></p> <p><i>"This journal is not held at UQ Library then. You can request a copy of your article through the Document Delivery service and UQ will get it for you from another library. Just remember that this can take some time."</i></p>
	<p><i>"Thanks! I have my article now."</i></p> <p><i>"Good luck with your research"</i></p>
