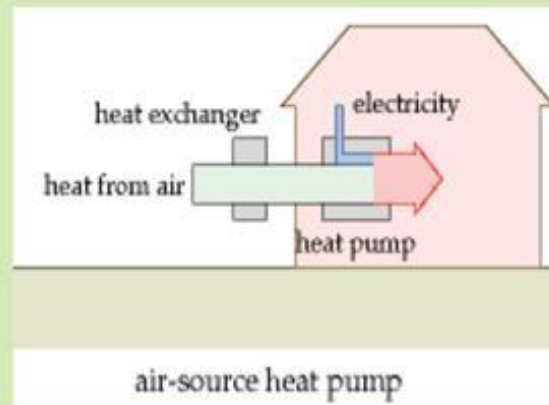


Fig. 1. Heat pumps (MacKay 2009 p.146).

In-text citation with page number to reference drawing

An in-text citation must contain:

- Name of the author/s
- Year of publication
- Specific page(s) if applicable

Reference list in alphabetical order of author/s' family name
Do not number references
