



Add video to your Blackboard site

Link, “embed”, or upload videos from:

- UQ Library catalogue – streamed videos
- Informit TVnews programs and clips
- Education in Video (video database) programs and clips, and other databases from Alexander Street Press
- YouTube
- TED and other websites

1. Link to streaming video through the UQ Library catalogue.

TV programs which are copied offair can be made available as “streaming” video, as well as copied onto DVDs for borrowing from the Library. When you ask the Library to keep a program for the collection, you can request a streaming copy at the same time.

Every record in the Library catalogue has a **stable URL** which can be used as a link in Word documents, Blackboard sites, and so on

Example:

The program, “Life at 5”, was copied offair and made available as a streaming video. Here is its catalogue record:

In a **Word document**, you can highlight text and choose “**Insert**” > “**Hyperlink**”, to make a link to the video record in the catalogue.

Example:

A hypothetical *Learning Guide* might say:

“This week, watch the video [“Life at 5”](http://library.uq.edu.au/record=b2506154~S7). This video can be borrowed on a DVD from UQ Library, or can be watched online via streaming video. “

2. Informit TVnews programs and clips

Informit TVNews is an online database of Australian news and current affairs TV programs and news clips. Available via the UQ Library catalogue.

To link to a whole series:

Do a Title search for the series name in the UQ Library catalogue; for example, *Message Stick*.

Copy the stable URL for the record and use it for linking.

To link to an individual broadcast or news story in Informit TVnews:

1. First, connect to the **Informit TVnews** database. Search or browse to find a program you would like to use.
2. Copy the program's URL, containing the UQ Library Ezproxy link, and add it to your Blackboard site. The Ezproxy link allows students not on a UQ campus to be identified as a legitimate user of this subscribed resource.

- **To link to whole videos**, just use the record link for the individual video, in the UQ Library catalogue.

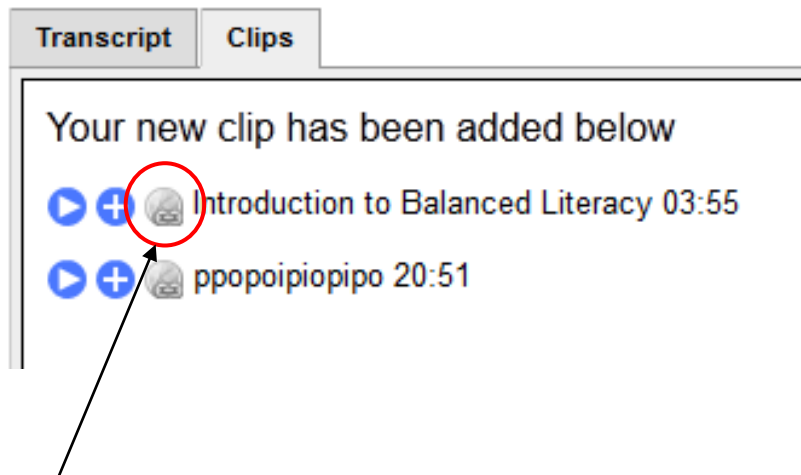
- **To create your own video clips**

First, access your chosen database via the UQ Library catalogue.

Quick instructions

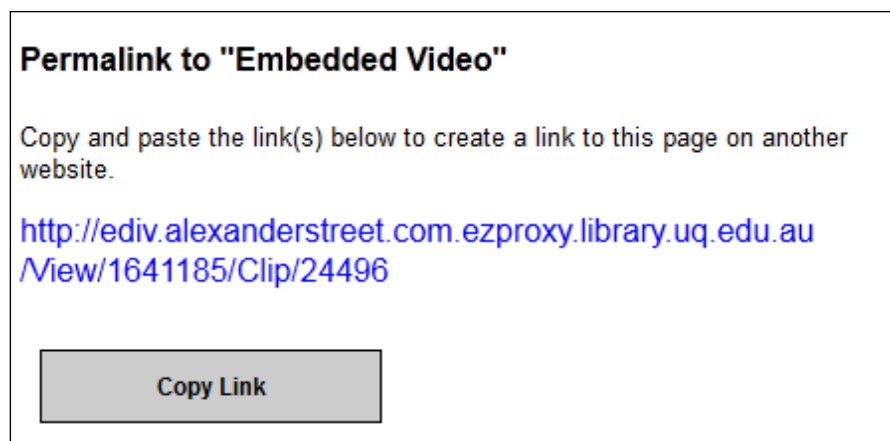
1. Login to the Alexander Street Press database (using your email address and password)
2. Click on the “Make clips” button, above the video screen.
3. Choose the beginning and end of your clip, by moving the green and red arrows, or by typing in the start and finish times.
4. Give your clip a name.
5. Choose to “share” your clip with your institution, or with everyone (don’t keep it for yourself if you want your students to be able to see it).
6. Save.

After you have saved your clip, you will see this screen:



Choose the little grey icon to view the unique URL for your video clip.

You will see:



The UQ ezproxy link is already included in the unique URL for your video clip.

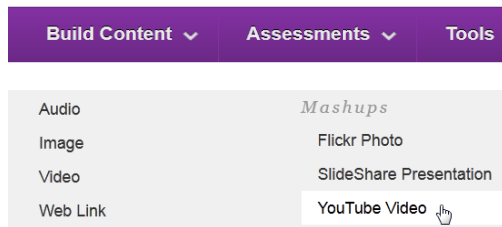
This link can be pasted into Blackboard, or into a Word document, such as a Learning Guide.

Your students will be able to view it from anywhere, by typing in their UQ login.

4. “Embed” videos from YouTube

Blackboard now has a special tool for adding YouTube videos to your site.

- Under “Build Content”, choose YouTube Video:



- Then search for a video using keywords. Alternatively if you have found a YouTube video through an Internet search you can add the YouTube URL to the search box.

- Add any additional notes. Click on **Submit** to finish adding the video to your Blackboard site.
- This is the preferred method, adding a clip via URL method does not work. Other embedding method explained below.

5. Embed videos from “TED” and elsewhere...

<http://www.ted.com/>

- On the TED site, search for a person or topic. For example:
Jane Goodall
- Choose a video, and look for the “**Embed**” button under the viewing screen:

Jane Goodall on what separates us from the apes

- You will see this box. Choose “**Embed this video**” and copy the code in the box to the right.

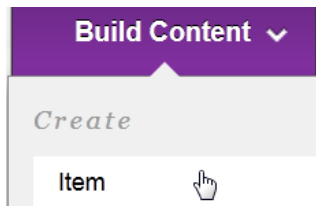

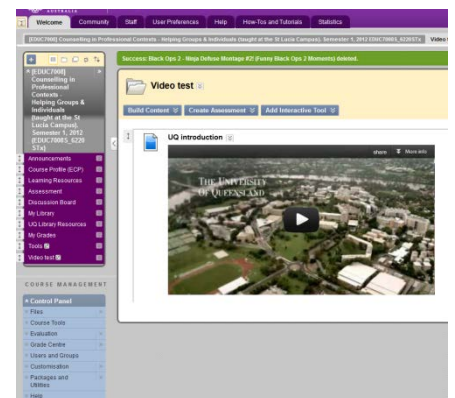
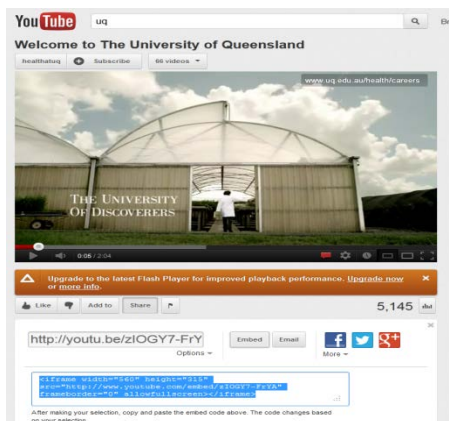
- Back in Blackboard, under **Build Content**, choose to create a new “Item”.



- Give it a title, and add any notes in the text box.
- Then click on the **button for html**, which looks like this: **< >**
- Paste in the embed code you copied from the TED site.
- Click on “**Submit**”, and voila!



The embed method is also available for YouTube clips, repeat process above.



6. To upload files greater than 10 MB to Blackboard, use Echo 360.
